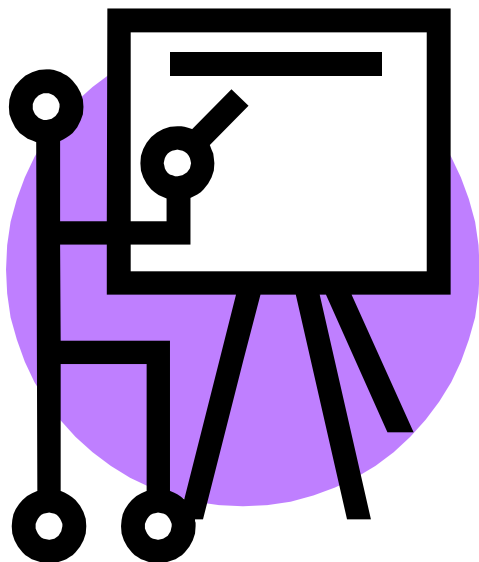


# LIN 4350: Sound System of English

This class focuses on describing, analyzing, and teaching the sounds of American English. In addition to learning the segmental (consonants & vowels) and suprasegmental (e.g., stress, rhythm, intonation) features of English speech, you will also gain the knowledge and skills necessary for practicing informed pronunciation teaching. Throughout this course you will demonstrate self-awareness with regard to values, beliefs, attitudes and behaviors. We will discuss the ubiquity of language variation and explore sociolinguistic linguistic themes related to accentedness. You will also demonstrate an ability to put into action professed values, beliefs, and attitudes that express concern for others.

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
