

## Concentration Requirements (31 credits)

### Recommended Language Preparation

Two semesters or equivalent competency prior to taking the language core course.

### Common Course Requirement – 6 credits

- LIN 3003 Language Matters
- LIT 4804 Literature as Cultural Study

### Core Requirement– 7 credits

- CLT 3370 Gods, Heroes, and Monsters in the Ancient World (3)
- LAT 2220 Intermediate Latin I (4)                      OR                      GRE 2220 Intermediate Classical Greek I (4)

### Electives (Classics field) – 3 credits

- CLA 3103 Daily Life in Ancient Greece
- CLA 3124 Daily Life in Ancient Rome
- CLT 3103 Epic Battles and Dramatic Reversals in Greek Thought
- CLA 3123 Voyages and Metamorphoses in Roman Imagination

### Electives (Interdisciplinary field) – 15 credits

- Courses can be selected from the fields of
  - Ancient History,
  - Philosophy
  - Religious Studies
  - Art History etc. with the approval of the ICC advisor.

## Minor – 15-18 credits

---

The ICC Minor (15 hours minimum) can be fulfilled in one of two ways:

1. Courses are divided by level, with the field of study unrestricted.

Pick two courses (6 hours) from the ICC Minor Core:

- Either CLA 3103 Greek Civilization or CLT 3101 Greek Literature in Translation
- Either CLA 3123 Roman Civilization or CLT 3102 Roman Literature in Translation
- CLT 3370 Classical Mythology
- One 2000 level course
  - 3-4 hours from 2000-3000 level courses in Anthropology, History, Philosophy and Religious Studies selected with the guidance and approval of the Coordinator.
- Two 3000/4000 level courses
  - 6-8 hours from 3000-4000 level courses in Anthropology, History, Philosophy and Religious Studies selected with the guidance and approval of the Coordinator.

2. Courses are organized along an interdisciplinary principle.

Two courses (6 hours) from the ICC Minor Core:

- Either CLA 3103 Greek Civilization or CLT 3101 Greek Literature in Translation
- Either CLA 3123 Roman Civilization or CLT 3102 Roman Literature in Translation
- CLT 3370 Classical Mythology
- 9-12 hours from the Interdisciplinary Requirements. The student will complete three 3-4 credit courses, one each from three of the following four fields: (1) Anthropology, (2) History, (3) Philosophy, (4) Religious Studies. Courses are chosen with the guidance and approval of the Coordinator from the list certified for the major.

## Interdisciplinary Classical Civilizations with Honors

---

To graduate with Honors in ICC, the successful candidate must complete all requirements for the ICC track, achieve proficiency in Latin or Greek, pass a sight translation exam in either Greek or Latin and produce a mentored thesis, defended before a committee of two faculty members drawn from Classics and at least one other cognate field (History, Philosophy, Religious Studies, etc.). Students must maintain a departmental and overall GPA of 3.50.
